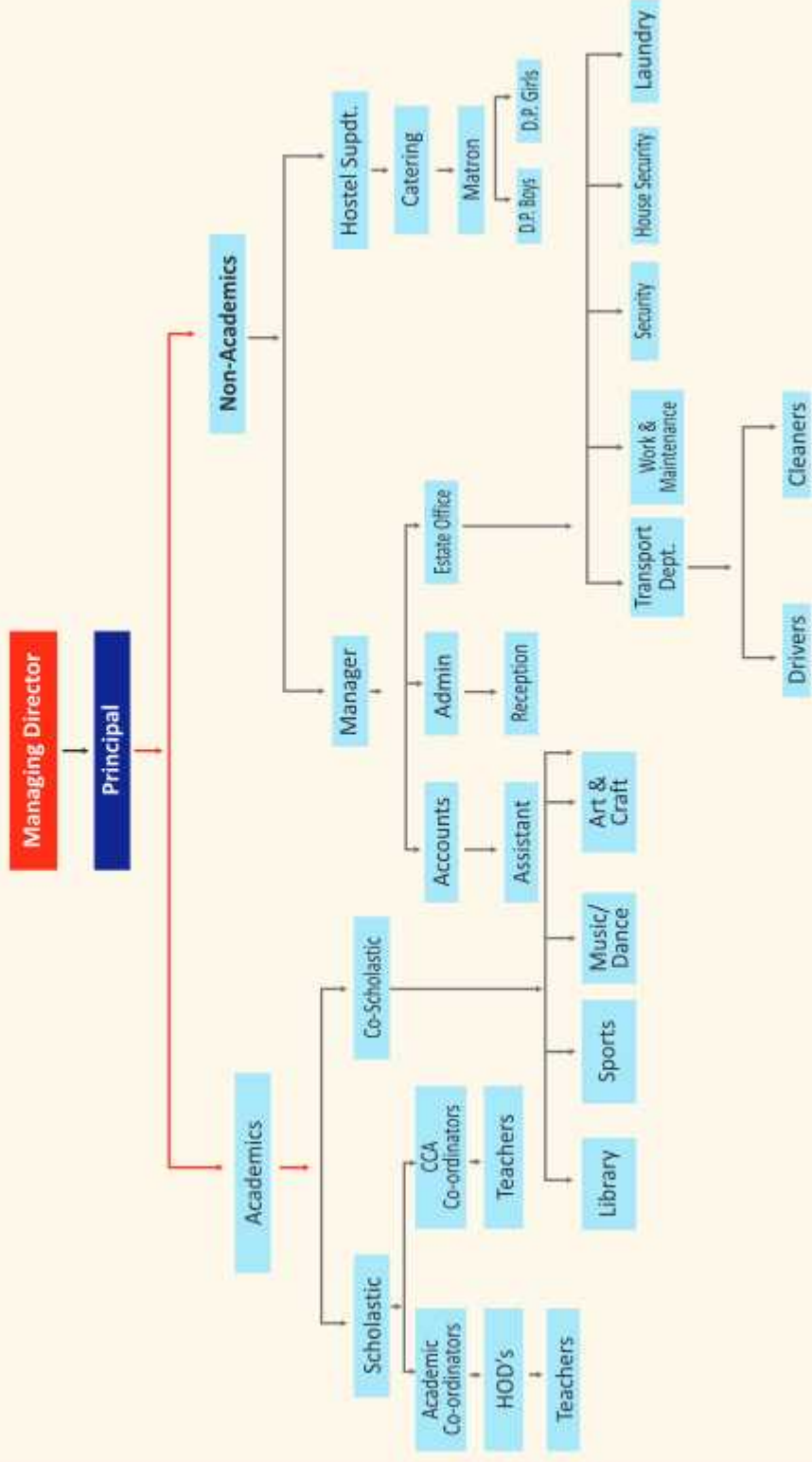

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS :

TEXT BOOKS / NOTE BOOKS & SCHOOL DIARY:

- The school will issue a School Diary to all the students. Parents are requested to study it in detail and use it as a means of communication between parents & school staff.
- Day-to-Day schedule mentioned in the Calendar of Events will be adhered rigidly. Changes will be strictly limited to unforeseen circumstances only. Prior information will be given for any change.
- Textbooks and other necessary materials will be given to the students once the school commences.

SATURDAYS:

- **For Classes I to III All Saturdays will be holidays.**
- **For Classes IV to XII/ PUC**, 1st and 3rd Saturdays school will remain closed and 2nd and 4th Saturdays school will function from 8:30 am to 2:50 pm.

ACTIVITIES:

Students can avail maximum benefit from outdoor activities like swimming, horse riding and adventure sports in the activity periods.

PARENT TEACHER MEETING (PTM):

Parent Teacher Meeting has been scheduled four times in the year. On this day teachers will meet parents from **9.30 am to 1 pm only**. These days are devoted entirely for parents. Students will not attend classes. If they come with their parents they must wear **school uniform**. Parents of Boarders and Day Scholars should please make a special effort to keep these days free. We would prefer both father and mother to visit us together. In case it is NOT possible, at least one of you should do so. These meetings are scheduled in such a way that parents may collect their wards - report cards and also meet the teachers to know their child's performance in school. Please make use of this opportunity without fail.

PAYMENT OF FEES:

Parents will pay the Annual Fees through campus uno in 3 instalments. Parents kindly note that Fee defaulters will not be allowed to attend classes or write exams.

UNIFORMS:

Parents are requested to ensure that their wards strictly adhere to the school dress code. Students will NOT be permitted to attend school, if they fail to dress properly.

- **Regular Uniform [Girls- I to IV]** Navy blue pinafore, light blue shirt, navy blue blazer, red tie and grey sweater and black shoes.
- **Regular Uniform [Girls-V to XII & PU]** Navy blue trousers, light blue shirt, navy blue blazer, red tie and grey sweater and black shoes.
- **Regular Uniform [Boys-I-IV]** Navy Blue Shorts, light blue shirt, navy blue blazer, red tie and grey sweater and black shoes.
- **Regular Uniform [Boys-V-XII & PU]** Navy blue trousers, light blue shirt, navy blue blazer, red tie and grey sweater and black shoes.
- **House Colour Uniform:** Red/Blue/Green/Yellow T-Shirt, Grey track pants and Black shoes.
- **Sports Uniform:** White T-Shirt, navy blue track pants and Black shoes.

- Parents are requested to purchase School bag, water bottle, swimming costume & Black Shoes for their ward.
- It is compulsory for a child from Classes I-V to take part in all the Sports and Games irrespective of their choice of preference. Students from Classes VI- XII & PU should give their preferences of any one discipline in Sports and Games in the prescribed format, duly signed by the parent, during the first week of reopening of the school. Coaching will be provided accordingly:

Sports- Yoga, Track and Field events, Swimming, Table Tennis, Golf and Badminton.

Games- Foot ball, Cricket, Volley ball, Basketball, Kabbadi and Kho-Kho.

COMMUNICATION:

Parents will be contacted through emails, Class newsletters, school diaries periodic letters from the school. We would like you to visit us as and when you desire without disturbing classes in progress. Please be free to speak to us on the phone, whenever required. Communication to the school is open through direct lines.

DISCIPLINE:

Students are to ensure that they abide by the **GROUND RULES (GR)** of the school. Violation of any of the following GR will constitute as a misdeed. Aiding and abetting (i.e. Collaborating with) students who violate a GR is in itself a violation.

Ground rules:

- Running and lingering (standing gossiping without any purpose) in the corridors, classroom, labs, dormitories, dining halls, etc.
- Leaning over parapet wall or leaning on the parapet.
- Running up and down the steps/sliding down banisters of staircases.
- Not keeping in line / talking in line, assembly etc.
- Thieving.
- Throwing paper, sweet / chocolate wrappers, litter, chalk or any type of missiles.
- Playing with school property-throwing items around.
- Causing blockage to toilets by throwing articles into inlet pans wash basins urinals and other toilet outlets .causing unhygienic conditions in toilets.
- Pelting stones-at each other in or around the campus.
- Wastage of food.
- Not keeping the dining tables clean.
- Found in or out of bound areas
 - i. Behind the school during class hours.
 - ii. Auditorium during school hours.
 - iii. Central staircase.
 - iv. Empty rooms
 - v. Toilet without permission
 - vi. Buildings under construction.
 - vii. Other places designated 'out of bound

- Bringing food / other items, forbidden to be brought from outside school, by boarders / day scholars / unauthorized persons (both are defaulters the bringer and the taker)
- Shouting, screaming, beating on furniture and walls, making unnecessary and obnoxious noise.
- Resorting to bumps or similar acts on birthdays of students.
- Talking back, being rude and disrespectful, disobedient to staff.
- Using calculators, CD players, Walkman & other Electronic gadgets
- Wearing sneakers is allowed only with casuals but not with uniform.
- Shirts of all types not tucked up
- In the classroom.
 - I. Distracting the class while teaching is in progress.
 - ii. Talking excessively in class while teaching is in progress.
 - iii. Chewing, eating in class.
 - iv. Leaving classroom without permission.
 - v. Creating disturbance in the class.
 - vi. Meddling with other students books and personal items.
 - Vii. Copying during tests/ exams
 - Viii. Fighting.
- Being improperly dressed whether in uniform, sports dress, house colours or casuals.
 Causing harassment or behaving inappropriately towards fellow students using physical harm or injury or could have resulted in injury.
- Use of intoxicants of any kind or smoking and asking other students to procure the same is prohibited.
- Damaging school or public property.

Note : Breaking any of the following ground rules will be dealt seriously resulting in expulsion from the school.
