


The event continued with the badging of school captains and house captains, representing the four houses:

With the Divine Blessings of Jagadguru Sri Sri Sri Dr. Balagangadharanatha Mahaswamiji



Today, I'd like to share with you a timeless wisdom from the Thirukkural, a celebrated Tamil masterpiece that teaches us the importance of morality and ethics in our daily lives.

A beautiful pearl of wisdom, 'Thirukkural' is a celebrated Tamil masterpiece written by the revered Tamil Philosopher Thiruvalluvar.

"ஒழுக்கம் விழுப்பம் தரலான் ஒழுக்<mark>கம் உயி</mark>ரினு<mark>ம் ஓம்ப</mark>ப்படு<mark>ம்</mark>" in English translates to

"Since good conduct confers eminence, it should be guarded more carefully than life itself." This couplet from Thirukkural emphasizes the supreme importance of good conduct, stating that it is more valuable than one's own life and should be cherished and protected with utmost care.

The Thirukkural's message of "Olukkam Viluppam Tharum" translates to "Morality brings prosperity" or "Righteousness leads to success." It's a foundational principle in the book, which emphasizes that acting ethically, with honesty and integrity, is crucial for personal and societal growth.

Let me share a simple yet powerful story that illustrates this principle.

Two friends, Anbu and Mani, both needed to get good grades to get a scholarship. Anbu decided to cheat on the exam, while Mani chose to study diligently. Anbu passed the exam by cheating, but Mani was not so lucky and had to repeat the course. However, Anbu's dishonesty was later discovered, and he lost the scholarship. Mani, despite his initial setback, worked even harder and eventually secured the scholarship.

What can we learn from this story?

The story highlights how while short-term gains may seem tempting, they often lead to negative consequences. Anbu's cheating cost him the scholarship and damaged his reputation.

Mani, on the other hand, achieved his goal through hard work and honesty, demonstrating that true success is built on ethical principles and not on deceit.

This story aligns perfectly with the Thirukkural's message: "Olukkam Viluppam Tharum." By choosing to be virtuous and ethical, Mani ultimately achieved his goal and had a greater sense of accomplishment.

Students will understand the place value of digits in a number. They will be able to write numbers in expanded form.


















"Origami House"




